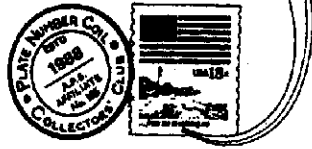

The words of finality struck deep into the hearts of PNCers as Alan Thomson announced his termination of the production of "SNIPPETS" in *COIL LINE*.

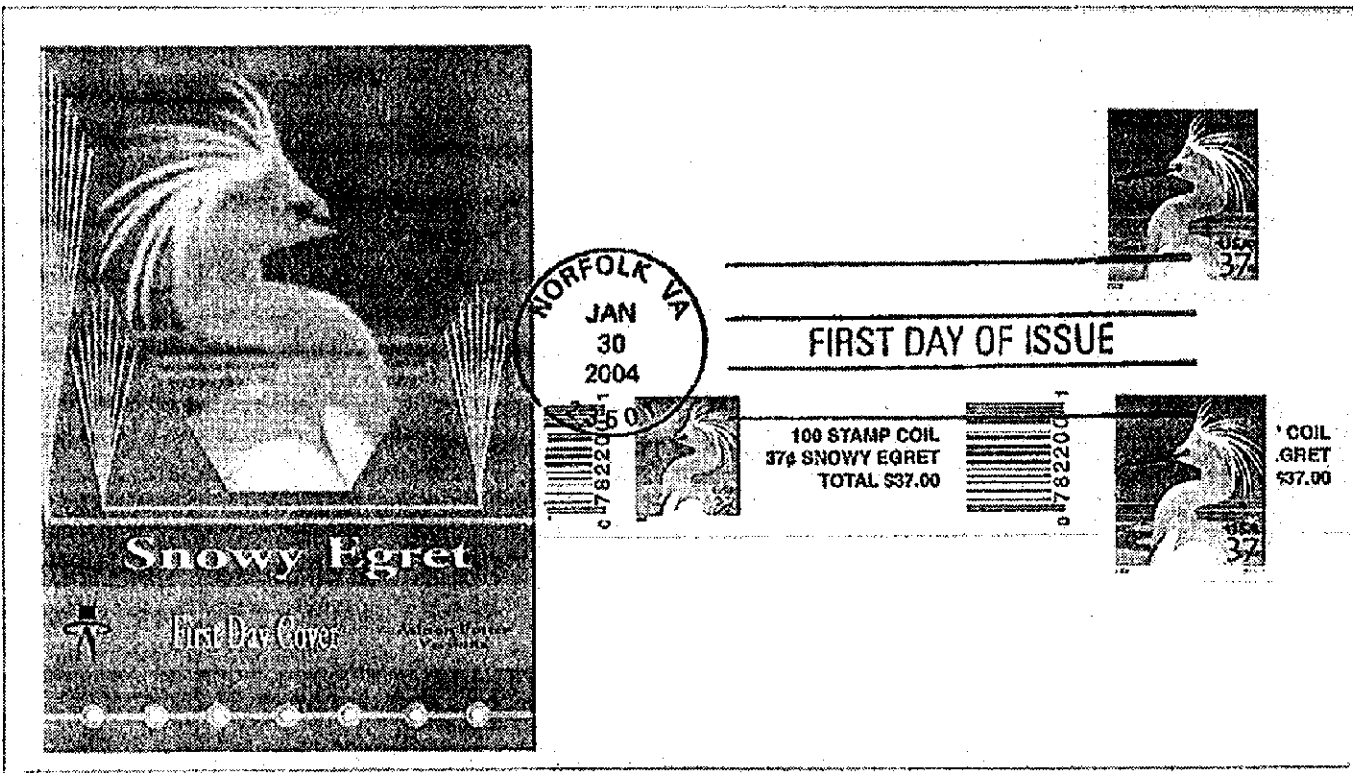
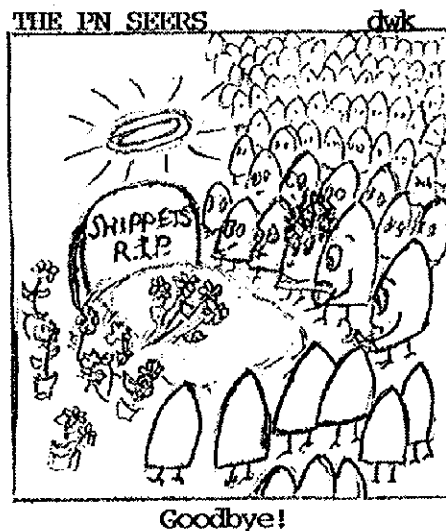
The column has been ongoing for many years and has provided us all with wit, wisdom, currency of issues and plain good sense. I'm sure I can speak for the many when

Above is a scan of an "unofficial" official First Day cancellation on the Ashton Potter Snowy Egret coil. While the Ashton Potter coil version had no official First Day, the booklet version did. Conrad Keydel was able to piggy back the coil version on the FDC for the booklet version. The labels are a continuation of Conrad's efforts to create FDCs with labels tied.

**The "Cobra" Die Cut Variety
37c Flag Waving (SSP) (SA)
PNC ID 2003-7**

Past issues of Coil Line have had articles about the die cut varieties on the 23c Washington (AVR) (SA) [2002-6] and the 37c Snowy Egret (AVR) (SA) [2003-8]. "Bell Top" and "Bell Bottom" have become familiar terms as have "Exposed Knoll" and "Imbedded Knoll". These die cut varieties are formed when the die cutting mat shifts in relation to the printed image. Below are images from the 37c Flag Waving (SA) from Sennett Security Products (SSP) caused by a similar die cutting shift, forming the shape of a cobra. While I have only found this variety on plate number S3333, they could potentially be on plates S1111, S2222 and future stamp stick plate numbers. When a collector finds this variety on an attached coil stick, it's likely that the whole stick will exhibit the same die cutting shift.

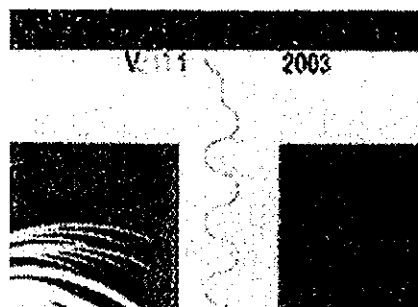
Scott and Peak Counts

Ever wonder why the self-adhesive Flag over Porch and Mountain die cut peak count varieties are not listed in the Scott Specialized catalog?

When I asked the catalog's editor "Why are these die cut varieties any less worthy of a catalog listing than the large and small hole varieties of the Liberty series coils?" he replied "In our experience, only a very tiny number of people care about these varieties."

If there is so little interest in these varieties, why do most PNC dealers list the varieties and why are collectors willing to pay significantly different prices for different varieties of the same plate number?

Egret Number on Top



A miscut on the Avery version of the Egret coil has produced a plate number on top. The number involved is V2111. This is the first report of a number on top since the 21c Bison V1111.

The miscut also reveals the die cut separator that is normally split between two rows of stamps. In this case, the separator plus the bottom peak from the row above and the top peak from this row combine to form the shape that has been named the bell.

Say Goodbye

The end of the variable denomination coil experiment is finally upon us. The last of the Unisys Postage and Mailing Center machines were scheduled to be removed from service in the VA suburbs of Washington, D. C. by May 1. The experiment began back in 1992 with ECA GARD machines and the Unisys machines were put into service in 1994.

37c Flag Tagging

The 2004 version of the self-adhesive 37c Flag in rolls of 3000 exists with both a smooth (uniform) tagging and a mottled (spotty) tagging, with the difference being obvious. Stamps from the rolls of 10000 so far have only been reported as having the smooth tagging.

37c Flag Imperfs

A total of four plate number combinations are now known imperf (die cut omitted) on the BEP version of the self-adhesive Flag coil. The new number is 6666. According to imperf specialist John Greenwood, numbers 3333, 4444 and 7777 had previously been reported imperf. The 7777 was also miscut while the other three are normally cut.

In addition to these, one miscut BEP roll has been found with partial Electric Eye registration bars at the top and no plate numbers (from the top row of the web). Only 52 of the stamps on the roll were imperf. It was originally reported by Kim Cuniberti in the April 14, 2003 issue of Linn's.

John also reports that the Sennett version of the self-adhesive Flag coil of 100 has just been found imperf. The plate number involved is S2222.

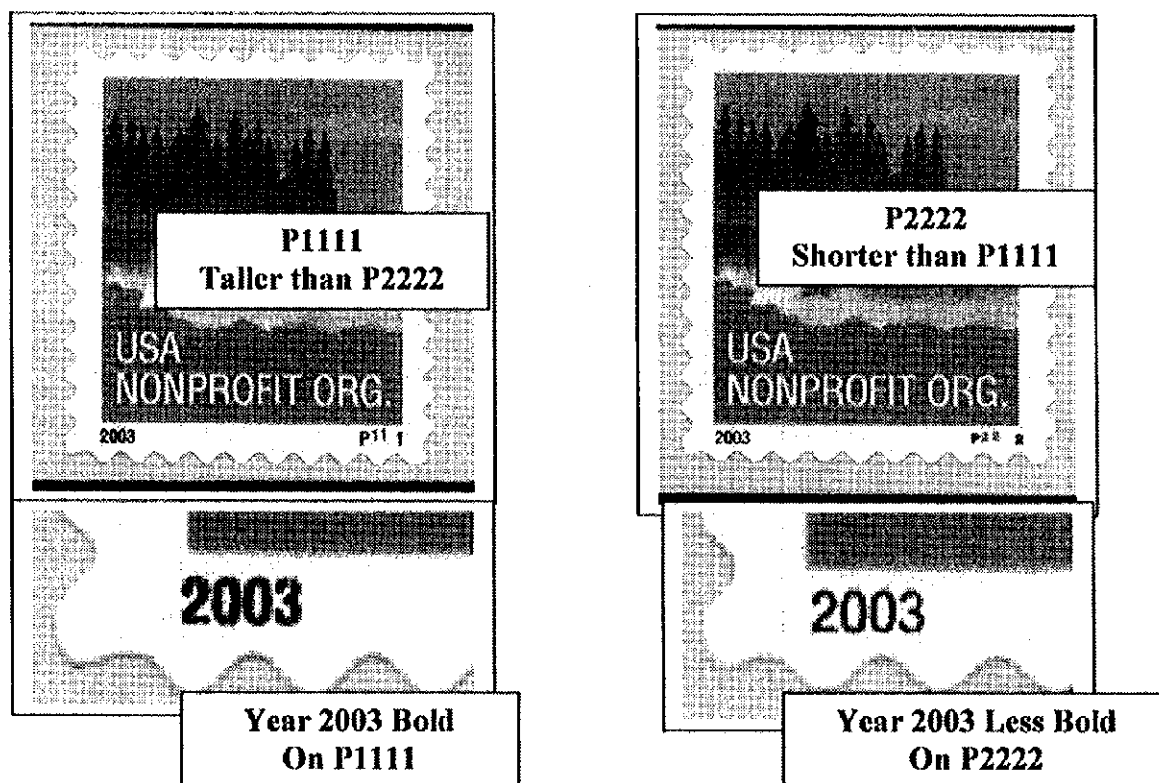

The new Plate No. P2222 on the 3K roll of the Ashton-Potter Self-Adhesive has notable differences from Plate No. P1111. The typeface used for plate number P2222 in the lower right corner is shorter than the typeface used for plate number P1111. The year shown in the lower left corner of both stamps is 2003, but the Plate No. P1111 stamp has the year in bolder type.

Backnumbers on P1111 were twenty stamps apart and could be upside down or right side up. On P2222 backnumbers are ten apart and have only been found right side up so far. Backnumbers can be 4-digits, 3-digits or 2-digits in length as on P1111. However, if you have a backnumber strip that has an odd number as the second digit from the right, this must come from a P2222 roll because P2222 rolls have backnumbers every ten stamps while P1111 rolls do not. For example, a strip with backnumber 1430 must, at the present time, come from a P2222 3K roll because the second digit from the right is odd.

The stamps of both plate numbers have die cutting on all four sides. This is unusual for self-adhesive coil stamps as most have a straight edge at the top and the bottom and die cutting on the sides. When die cutting on all four sides appeared on the first SA Seacoast stamp, it was deemed an experiment.

The Catalog Committee assigns PNC ID 2003-5 to both plates P1111 and P2222 as P2222 is considered another plate number of the same issue.

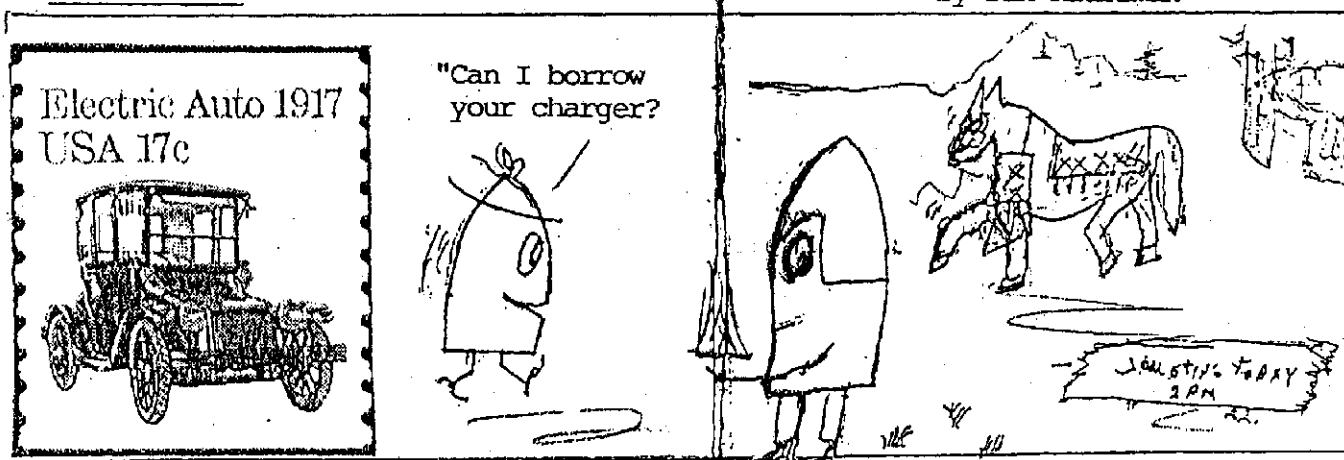
PN SEERS reflect that memory by those little loops at their tops.

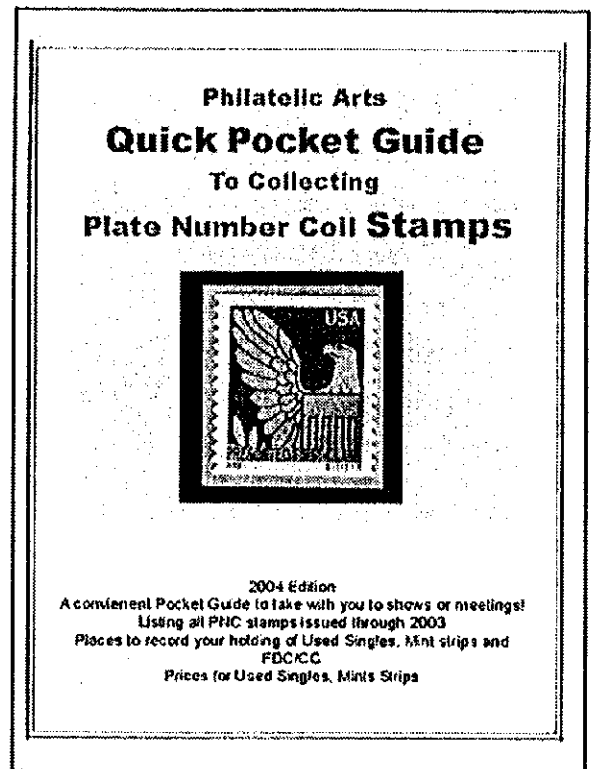
