WAG Silver Coffeepot coil due Sept. 16

The U.S. Postal Service has released a preliminary illustration of the 3c water-activated coil stamp its plans to issue Sept. 16 in Milwaukee. The stamp is to be issued at the Milcopex stamp show.

Plans calls for the stamp to be issued in rolls of 10,000. It will be the sixth different face stamp in the American Design series. Additional details will be announced later.

New Catalog offerings

With this issue of *Coil Line* is an order form for new Catalog Pages to be published in June 2005. Below is more detail on each of these offerings.

2004 New PNC Issues This is a new offering and covers the six new issues of 2004 i.e., the 37c Flag from Sennett (2004-1), the 37c Snowy Egret from Ashton Potter (2004-2), the (25c) gummed American Eagle (2004-3), the (5c) gummed Seacoast from Sennett (2004-4), the (5c) SA Seacoast from Sennett (2004-5) and the (10c) Lion with the 2003 date (2004-6). These pages are offered in color or black and white.

Illustrated Glossary This is a new offering. Many have requested a hard copy version of terms used by PNC collectors. Whether new to PNCs or an old hand, you will like this reference with color illustrations of hard to explain terms. We do not intend to publish this every year so get it while you can.

2002-2003 New Issue Updates For the past two years the catalog committee has offered New Issue pages for PNCs that came out in the preceding year. We have identified six PNC IDs from 2002 and 2003 New Issues that need updates. Here you will see new images of the Tagged Seacoast (2003-5) or see and read about the different color order on the 37c BEP Flag (2002-4). This product is only offered in color.

Avery Die Cut Varieties In the past, information on Avery die cuts (both normal and shifted) was contained either on the 23c Washington pages (2002-6) or the 37c Snowy Egret pages (2003-8). This new offering brings the discussion together in one document. Images from these two are shown side-by-side along with new 21c Bison images (2001-2). A new chart shows what shifted die cuts are possible for the various issues.

PNC ID Lists This is a republication of the PNC ID lists we have offered every year but with the new issues of 2004 added. There are three lists. The first in PNC ID

order shows all PNC IDs assigned so far and their known plate numbers. The second list is in Scott Number sequence. It allows you to look up the PNC ID and PNC if you know the Scott Number. The third list is the Name Index. If you know the name of the issue, this list allows you to find the PNC ID number for it.

Our printing costs have gone up some this year because we had to switch from a non-profit printer to a commercial printing company. Printing quality will not suffer. Our printing costs per item go down a little as we print more copies. We have made estimates of the number of copies we expect to sell and have priced each product to at least break even. If we sell many more than expected of any one item, the club saves money and costs for a future offering of the same product will be less.

The prices for each item are on the order form. You may order up to five products for the same basic postage and handling charge. If your total quantity goes over 5 items, please pay the basic charge for postage and handling again and add the per item cost shown. These are pre-publication prices. Please have your order in by the deadline shown on the form. We cannot cost effectively print a few more extra copies.

There is also an Anniversary shirt order on the back of the Catalog order form. This is your last chance to order a shirt and expect to have it delivered before STAMP-SHOW in Grand Rapids, MI this August.

PNC album would be a tough item

To the Editor:

I would like to respond in regards to the letter written by Jim Cate in the May issue of *Coil Line*.

I have doubts that the club or anyone could produce an album that would satisfy the collecting interests of over 800 members. This is proven by the Scott Publishing Companies staying with a very basic standardized comprehensive album.

There are far too many variations that collectors are interested in, numbers bottom and top, gum variations, perforation and die cuts, taggings, and back numbers with color variations as well as top and bottom positions. Any complete album created would leave many unfilled spaces for the average collector as well as the opposite having no space for some specials.

As an alternate, I would like to suggest that individuals look into a very reasonable computer program "AlbumPro" developed by Well Centered Publishing Company. They are located at P.O. Box 8459, Greenville, SC 29604 (1-864-233-6386). This will produce high quality album pages with selected borders as well as block outlines for the coils. It will accommodate all variations from

Blast from the Past

Brian Engler was going through a collection he purchased and found a big surprise among the BEP version of the old Presorted 23c USA (Sc. 2607). There were two PS's that were tagged. One had shiny gum and one had low gloss gum. Tagged examples with low gloss gum were previously unknown.

Since this was a service inscribed stamp, this strip must have come either from the Caves or from a philatelic center, so there must be other examples out there in dealers' or collectors' hands that are currently unrecognized for what they are.

Flip Flop

With the 5555A printing of the 37c Flag coil, the BEP has reverted back to the yellow red blue black order of the colors in the plate number that it used for 1111 through 9999. For the 1111A through 4444A, they had switched to a blue red yellow black order. The color orders in the plate number typically represent the order that the colors were applied on the press. It is unknown why they made either switch.

Tagged Lion

Mint strips of the lightly tagged Lion S55555 have been found, but details are not available at this time.

New Atlas Number

The list keeps growing. Scott Adams has just found a cover bearing an Atlas V21211.

More used census data on the 23c G. Washington has arrived, but I have not had the chance to properly analyze it all, so an update will have to wait till next month.

I have an exciting find to report this month! For the first time, a member reports holding a mint PS5 example of the (10¢) Green Bike #333 with rounded shoulders! This elusive die variety had previously been reported only twice before, one used single and an example on cover. Here's a scan.



This find can be attributed to the recent publication of the second edition of the PNC³ *PNC Values List*. The finder stated that he was looking through his collection with the new Values List in hand to see what he 'really' had. Turns out he really had something of importance. Good job!

There have been other reports this month that increase the count for almost all of the varieties and numbers on the list below (except the Mountains). Thanks to all who have contributed their time and effort to this cause.

OK now, there are five service inscribed issues (plus three Flag Over Porch) on the list with die varieties (or plate numbers) not yet reported mint. Let's all get into a search mode, have a careful look through those collections and accumulations, and find some more.

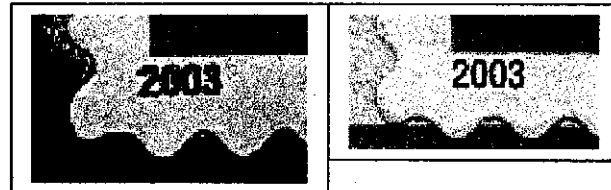
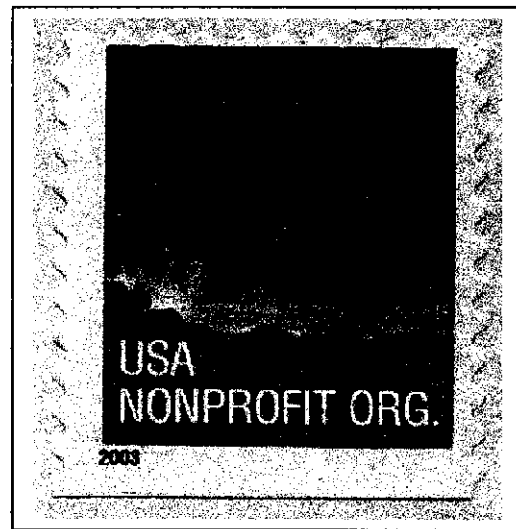

Seacoast with serpentine die cuts on 3 sides

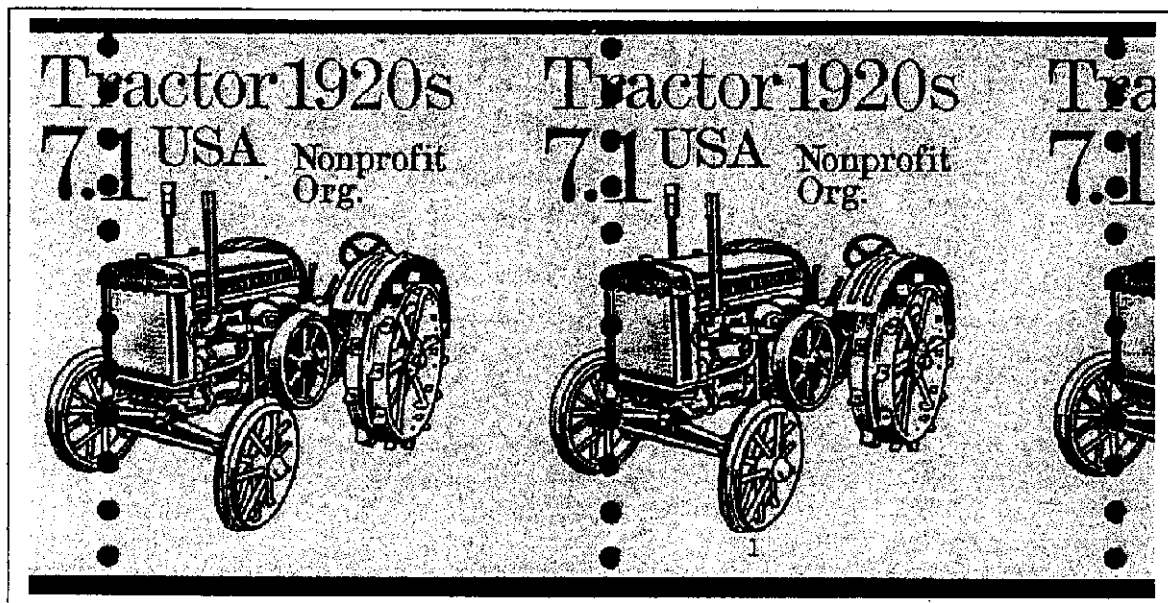
To the right is a (5c) Seacoast (2003-5) which Jeff Fiszbein brought to the Plymouth Regional Meeting. It has serpentine die cuts only on three sides. This Seacoast is normally found with serpentine die cuts on the two vertical sides or on all four sides.

Gene Trinks, the Regional Meeting host, speculated that the web was shifted up during the die cutting process and this stamp which was on the bottom row missed the bottom die cutting knife.

Jeff also brought in examples of the same Seacoast with thick and thin dates shown to the right. I believe the thinner date to be from Plate P2222 while the thicker one is from Plate P1111.



7.1c Tractor Service Inscribed "Nonprofit Org." Misperf Plate #1 (PNC ID 1987-5)



Tom Jillson brought the above misperforated example to scan. Most PNC collectors like their stamps well centered, but stamps with perforation errors are desirable too. The Catalog Committee is building a storehouse of images like the above for possible use in the PNC³ Catalog. More images will be scanned at the August STAMPSHOW.

Sennett's SA Lion S55555 was printed with a different size cylinder than the other plate numbers. Consequently the plate number interval changed from 21 to 20.

Ashton Potter's SA Seacoast P2222 was die cut with two different mats. One is serpentine cut on all four sides while the other has serpentine cuts on the sides and straight cuts on top and bottom.

● In printing the SA Seacoast with cylinders P2222, and P3333 Ashton Potter changed the cylinder size from that used to print P1111. Consequently the plate number intervals changed from 22 to 27. P3333 has a small date and color laydown of BCMY.

■ The Kestrels differ in the order of color laydown. Colors are black, yellow, cyan and magenta. Type I sequence is BYCM. Type II is BCYM. Type III is YMCB. The color order shows in the plate number.

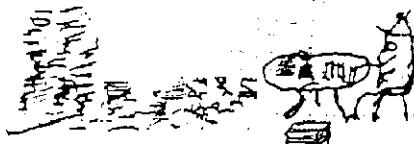

HP offers a low cost full color printer in the 100C series. The quality of printing equals or exceeds that of the standard Scott pages. With this method, an album to satisfy each person's interests can be self produced.

I am not implying that Mr. Cates' position is incorrect, but only that there is an alternative available.
