Message from the President:

Denominated Liberty's ahead of plans

The first denominated Lady Liberty & Flag coil with "39 USA" on its face is here. I know this first hand because some anonymous PNCer sent me a cover with a sprayed on snowman and "Happy Holidays" slogan cancel postmarked "06 Jan 2006" from Albany NY. January 6th was two days before this 10K roll with plate V1111 was scheduled to be released.

Inside the envelope was a postal bulletin giving the production specifications for the coil. A 3K roll of the same stamp goes on sale February 8, 2006 nationwide.

Strips of this 39c coil have spaces between the stamps with a five-digit aqua middle back number. The back number and plate number are both ten stamps apart (constant back number roll) so that on a given roll the back number will always be in the same spot in relation to the plate number. On the first rolls reported, the back number and plate number could not be shown together on a PS5. However with print run of 200 million it's likely you can eventually find any back number position you may want.

The January 9th *Linn's Stamp News* announced that a 24c coil featuring the Common Buckeye (a butterfly) would be released March 8th. The 24c stamp will pay both the post card and second ounce first class rate.

The same article mentioned a 39c American Crops coil to be issued March 16th at the Stamp Mega-Event in New York City. There will be five different designs in this coil. Coil collectors will probably save this as a PS9. Long strips create storage problems for coil collectors. Write the *Coil Line* Editor and tell him how you store your PS9 and PS11 strips so that we all can be prepared when the American Crops coil arrives.

The Catalog Committee is finalizing the 2005 New Issue pages. I expect these to be offered next month along with updated PNC ID lists. I will discuss the catalog offerings in more detail when the order form appears in *Coil Line*.

Mailer's postmarks another collectible

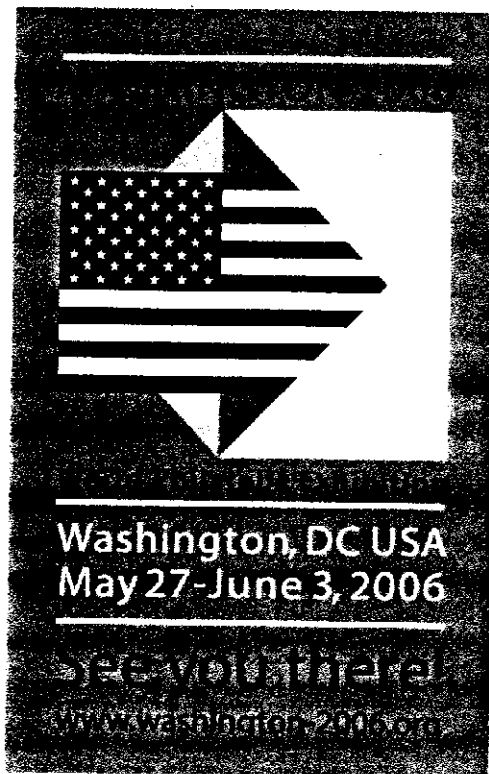
To the Editor:

The recent letter on "mailer's postmarks" caught my attention. I have been collecting the "junk mail" since the judges of my nondenominated exhibit said, "to be of value the exhibit needs envelopes showing usage." I'm still looking and can not find all of the issues of nondenominated stamps on envelopes.

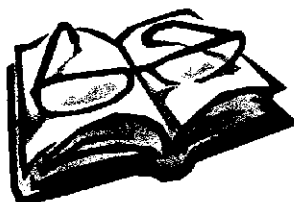
Moreover, I find it is even more difficult to find the "mailer's mark" on the junk mail. Seems to me from my limited (a few years) experience, I find many more envelopes with the uncanceled nondenominated stamps than those with the "mailer's mark."

Thus, I would think the Scott catalogue is a little off base by suggesting the "mailer's mark" envelopes or stamps are less valuable than the uncanceled stamps. I have found to get some of these stamps canceled I have to send them to myself (or friends who returned them to me). Unfortunately, these are stamped by the postal clerk with their red circle ink stamps that sometimes destroys the stamp if you try to remove it from the envelop (the red ink tends to run when soaking).

(39c) NDN Lady Liberty &
U. S. Flag (SSP) (WAG)
Plate S1111
PNC ID 2005-5

The water-activated nondenominated Lady Liberty & U. S. Flag (2005-5) was issued without ceremony on December 8, 2005 in rolls of 3000. It will pay the 39 cent first class rate that went into effect January 8, 2006. Three other coil stamps of the same design were issued the same day. All are shown in the table at the bottom of this page.

Four digit pink back numbers on the WAG coil occur at 10 stamp intervals on the top, middle or bottom. Back numbers on a single roll will be either odd or even. On even rolls, back numbers will be on the same stamp as the plate number every 70 stamps. On odd rolls, the closest the back number will come to the plate number is one right or one left. Six rolls are needed to obtain all possible back number positions.

The S1111 plate number appears every 14 stamps along the roll. There is a black 2006 date in the lower left corner of every stamp. Sennett Security Products (SSP) manufactured this coil.

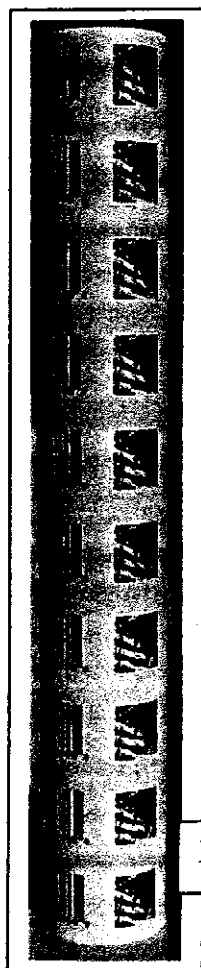

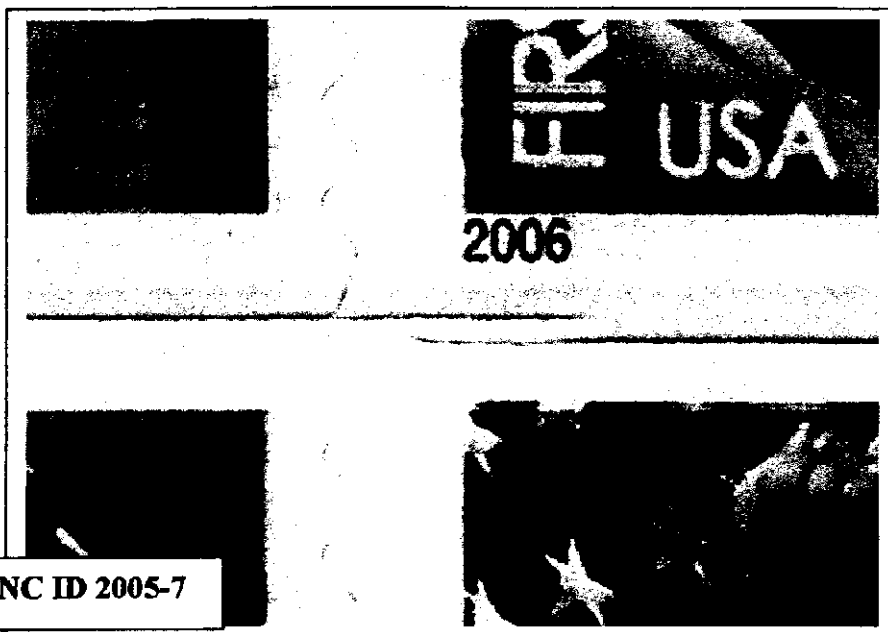
Mis-slit Sennett and Ashton Potter Coils

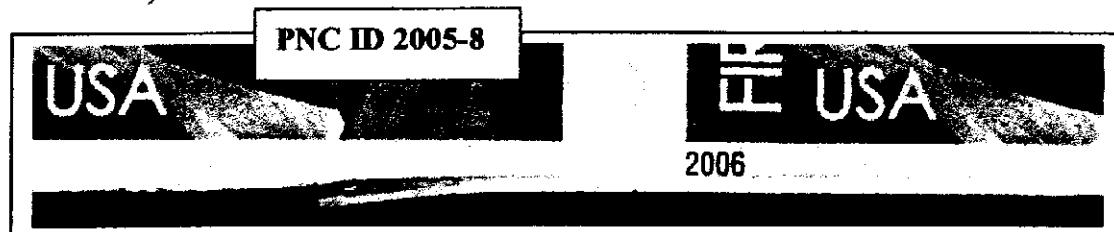
Coils are printed on a web of paper many stamps high. The number varies depending on the printing press. Most coils are cut apart from the coil above it and beneath it before being individually wrapped and sold to the public. The exception is the Sennett Security Product coils which are slit, but not detached from one another until they are sold to the public. A small "bridge" of paper holds the coil stack together. See an illustration of a "stamp stick" below.



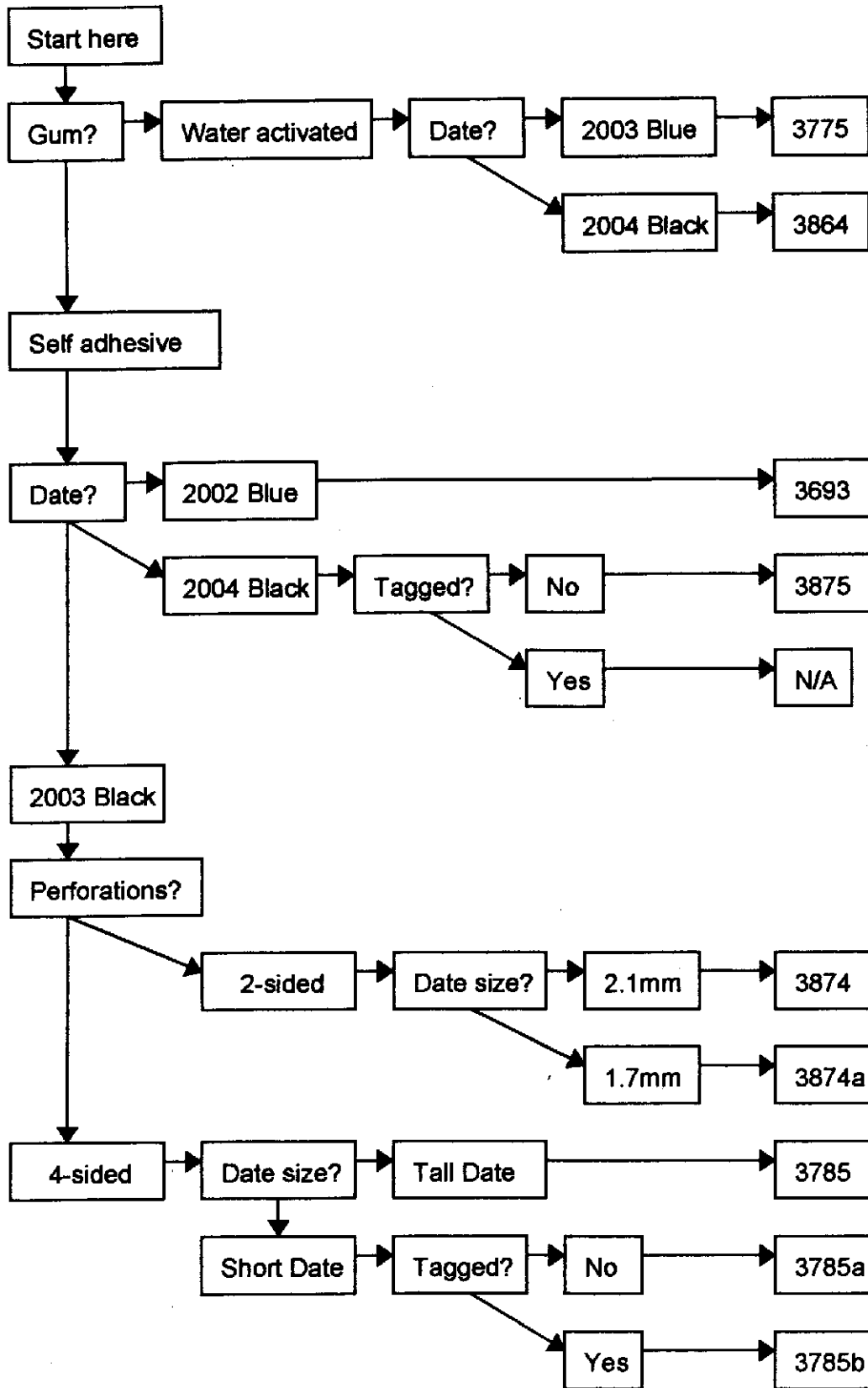
Before I saw the coil below, I thought the slitting process for the Sennett coils was probably a cutting wheel like a pizza cutter that rolled between the coil rows. Note that in the illustration below there are two cuts that overlap. To cause such a cut, the web of paper must have shifted between the first cut and the second. If the two cuts had aligned perfectly, one would not be able to tell where the cut began and ended.



Below is a similar mis-slit from the Ashton-Potter NDN Lady Liberty & U. S. Flag (PNC ID 2005-8).

Sennett's SA Lion S55555 was printed with a different size cylinder than previous plate numbers. Consequently the plate number interval changed from 21 to 20. S55555 & higher have the 20 interval.

Ashton Potter's SA Seacoast P2222 was die cut with two different mats. One is serpentine cut on all four sides while the other has serpentine cuts on the sides and straight cuts on top and bottom.

● In printing the SA Seacoast with cylinders P2222 through P7777 AP changed the cylinder size from that used to print P1111. Thus the plate number intervals changed from 22 to 27. P3333 through P7777 have a small date and color order of BCMY.

■ The Kestrels differ in the order of color laydown. Colors are black, yellow, cyan and magenta, Type I sequence is BYCM. Type II is BCYM. Type III is YMCB. The color order shows in the plate number.

Glossary Update

The following terms have been added recently to the Glossary of Terms that is part of the pnc3.org Web site. The comprehensive glossary provides a good source to help understand your collection and what you read in *Coil Line*.

Bridge

A Bridge is the tiny tab that holds coil rolls together in a "Stick" about one every five stamps, with the placement randomly staggered in the stamp rows like brick seams in a wall. The term "bridges" was used by Sennett Security Products (SSP) when the 29¢ Tulip was issued in sticks of 10. The bridge on the Sennett 37¢ Flag stick stamps and the 39¢ Lady Liberty stick stamps is the same as that used on the Tulip. Click here for a page showing the Flag stick stamps with Bridges.

Stick

Stick refers to a vertical stack of two or more coils (up to ten) held together by "Bridges". Stamps produced by Sennett Security Products (SSP) in this configuration are the 29¢ Tulip, the 37¢ U. S. Flag and the 39¢ Lady Liberty. Click here for an illustration.

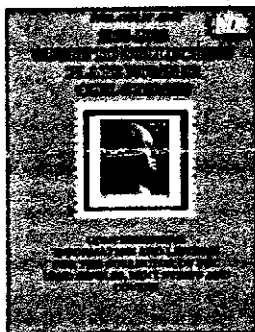
Tie

A Tie is the connecting portion in an incision between Pressure Sensitive Adhesive (PSA) stamps. References include TTL (tie tip left) and TTR (tie tip right). Refer to *Coil Line* issues: (Snippets 8/98 and 9/98) and (Nazar 9/98).
