


PNC³ Official Ballot for 2006 Elections



Plymouth Show Regional Meeting

The annual Plymouth Show PNC³ regional meeting was held on April 29. PNC3 Webmaster, Ron Maifeld, chaired the meeting. While our numbers were small (12), our discussions, which covered a wide range of topics and issues, were enthusiastic and informative.

These included:

- Poorly cut V/P die cuts on the recently issued Crops of the Americas coil that masquerade as P/P (See Frank Covey's discussion in the May issue of Coil Line). True P/V die cuts on this issue are yet to be reported.
- Deep valley and shallow valley die cut versions of the Sea Coast coil
- A plea for the simplification and standardization of the methods we use to specify back # positions from Dan Kauffman
- The announcement of a project to add a checklist of PNC labels together with individual label scans to the PNC3 web site – Ron Maifeld and Con Keydel
- The intricacies of USPS item # assignment item # assignments used by coil producers vs. the Kansas City Philatelic office - Jay Bigalke.
- Jim LaPlante showed a strip from 2c Woodpecker coil that he thought might be lightly tagged. When examined under a portable UV device the strip definitely was brighter than a "normal" strip with which it was compared. Unfortunately, the lighting conditions in our meeting room did not allow for any definitive judgments. It was suggested Jim send the strip to UV expert, Wayne Youngblood, for his opinion.

There were door prizes for everyone. Dan Kauffman donated several examples of used singles of the SA 37c # B1111 with 2003 year date and Keydel provided a number of his Cover Kraft FDCs from recent coil issues. Always a good time when PNC folks gather. – ConradKeydel


Catalog Offerings

Letter

Another take on Scott 3633A

To the Editor:

I disagree with you. As early as a year ago I priced the 3633A PS5 at \$2 above the corresponding BEP and Sennett versions of this 37c self-adhesive coil. I spoke with Frank Marrelli, a major wholesaler of coil material. He states that the demand for PNCs and mint scrap for this issue has been very strong. He wholesales the mint singles at \$1.10 while the BEP and Sennett versions wholesale at less than half that.

Dealers recognized the scarcity of this issue well after supplies disappeared from post offices. Remember that Banknote Corp. did NOT win the bid several years ago to provide the USPS with stamps and therefore they stopped production of this issue after this one run.

This data represents the findings of 5 of our used PNC hunters; Bob Murrin, Chris Landa, Jeff Fiszbein, Ron Hayes, and Vic Collinino (they are identified in random order as persons A through E in the table).

Clearly the V2111 and V3222 are the weeds in the Egret garden (in fact person E got tired of counting and just listed their quantities as greater than a certain large number).

Equally clear is that the V2121, V3211 and V3221 are quite scarce (the first two of which are unreported in mint condition).

Given the scarcity of these numbers, they would have been distributed to only limited regions of the country for a limited period of time. Although persons B and C found roughly the same total number of PNC's, person B was much luckier in where and/or when his stamps came from. This underscores the need to look at data from multiple sources when trying to draw conclusions.

The 3829A data shows a decrease for each successive plate number and it would appear that the P55555 is relatively scarce, but this may only be a time bias due to the normal delay between when a number is released and when it starts showing up in mixtures. Since the three scarce 3829 numbers were also the last of the 3829's to turn up, there may also be a time bias in their numbers and I hope to provide an update in the future (and hope to report on the Atlas at some time too).

[Note: Please don't add up the numbers and say there are only x known copies of Vxxxx as I do have a few additional reports of these numbers, but I either lack a full set of data or the data is very out of date, so I did not include them in the table.]

Plate S1111

PNC ID 2006-4

The 39c Official Coil showing the Great Seal of the United States went on sale March 8, 2006, two months after the First Class rate increased to 39 cents.


This water-activated gummed (WAG) coil of 100 is packaged in sticks of 10 like other recent offerings from Sennett Security Products.

S111 is the only known plate number. The plate number shows in the lower right hand corner every 14th stamp along the roll.


The rolls of 100 have no back numbers. The wrapper that binds the roll holds the stick together. On the inside of the coil is a cardboard core similar to the one found on the WAG 39c Liberty/Flag (2006-3). The last four stamps on the roll are likely to have residue left from the adhesive used to affix the stamps to the core.

Full rolls and strips of 25 can be purchased from Philatelic Fulfillment in Kansas City MO (1 800 STAMP24).

Shown below is the portion of two wrappers with printing. The bottom wrapper is held to the one above it by a tiny uncut piece of paper called a bridge. The stamps themselves have no bridges.


Catalog Corner



The American Crops self-adhesive coil of 100 was released March 16, 2006 at the Mega Stamp Show in New York NY. It was available nationwide a day later.

Shown to the right are the 5 American crop designs. The leader strip, which seals the coil, features the peppers design. These are delivered to post offices in sticks of 10 with 5 sticks to a box. The stick is held together by tiny pieces of uncut paper called bridges that hold one coil to another. It is possible to save strips with one coil stacked on top of another.

The coil starts with a sunflower. The plate number is on the sunflower design. A sunflower repeats every 5th stamp, but a sunflower with plate number only occurs on every 25th stamp. Collectors will prefer to collect these as PS11 to show all designs and the sunflower with and without a plate number. S1111 is the only plate known to date.
